Choral at Cadogan celebrates some of the finest choral ensembles from around the world. This season is no different, with repertoire spanning the renaissance to the present day, and concluding with a very rare opportunity to hear The Tallis Scholars sing the most romantic music there is - Rachmaninov's *Vespers*.

Among the highlights are Voices New Zealand, who celebrate their 20th anniversary. They bring with them a unique view of native and European music, skilfully mixing old and new, local and distant.

Also joining us for the first time this year are the Choir of St George's Chapel, Windsor, who will be ending a busy year at the Chapel where there will be not one, but two Royal weddings. Their thoughtful advent programme makes a great start to the festive season.

Another series debut will come from The Gesualdo Six, led by the dynamic conductor and composer, Owain Park. This male voice *a cappella* ensemble, known for their high quality programming, leapt onto the world stage in 2014. Their debut recording, released in January 2018 to great critical acclaim, was described as 'spellbinding' by the Telegraph.

VOCES8 need little introduction to those familiar with the choral world. We are thrilled they can join us this year. They present one of their typically feisty programmes - an all-round delight.

And then The Tallis Scholars will present two special programmes of their own. First, a concert which showcases the dazzling music of the *Eton Choirbook*, followed as promised, at the end of the season, by Rachmaninov's *Vespers*. There is nothing else guite like it.

This year, for the first time, the series is lending its support to a charity - The Muze Trust - whose aim is to ensure that children in disadvantaged communities in Zambia have access to music education at the most basic level, including the provision of instruments. I have been involved with this charity since the outset and I'm delighted to continue to support their work. You can find more information about the charity at www.themuzetrust.org. One of the glories of English sacred music is the repertoire contained in the *Eton Choirbook*. This music is rarely performed – its highly ornate style tends to frighten choirs off – but this should not disguise the fact that its most important composer, John Browne, was the greatest genius of his time. We sing in this programme his uniquely moving *Stabat mater*. Taverner's 6-voice *Magnificat* is also in this ornate style – indeed it might be said to be even more ornate – as is Sheppard's only known votive antiphon, *Gaude virgo christipera*. We also sing two shorter pieces by Cornysh from the *Eton Choirbook*, alongside Tallis's beautifully effective *Te Deum*. All in all, a feast.

With its distinct antipodean sound, Voices New Zealand come to Choral at Cadogan as part of their 20th anniversary tour to Europe. In this unique concert, sound worlds from opposite sides of the globe collide in an exhilarating performance. The programme infuses the qualities of the ensemble's pacific origins, with western choral repertoire. This parallel and apparent disparity is the central theme of *Voices Of Aotearoa*, a hallmark programme by Voices New Zealand. From the dramatic and impassioned opening processional, *Laudes Regiae*, to the emotionally charged *Bogoróditse Djévo*, this beautifully put together programme celebrates Advent and the coming of the Messiah. The Choir of St George's Chapel, directed by James Vivian, was founded in 1348 and, with the exception of the Commonwealth period (1649-60), has sung the services continuously since then. They sing regularly in the presence of the Queen and other members of the Royal family, and most notably, sang for the wedding of Prince Harry and Meghan Markle in May 2018.

The great set of *Vespers* by Sergei Rachmaninov may not be associated with the style of The Tallis Scholars, but it is wrong to assume that there is only one way of performing a masterpiece. I have often directed a leading Moscow choir in Tallis and Byrd and found the results both legitimate and heartening. And having been fascinated by the Orthodox repertoire since John Tavener introduced me to it in the late '70s, I have revisited that interest here.





Getting to Cadogan Hall

The easiest way to travel to Cadogan Hall is by public transport. Located two minutes walk from Sloane Square tube, served by District and Circle lines, just one stop from Victoria station which has both mainline and additional tube connections.

Sloane Square Underground Two minutes walk

Upon exiting Sloane Square Station, turn immediately right, passing the Royal Court Theatre. (You will see Cadogan Hall's tower immediately before you). Cross over Cliveden Place and walk up Sedding Street to the Hall.

Sloane Square one minute walk


Taxis are numerous in the area and there is a taxi rank located on Sloane Square opposite the Underground Station.
